

## Removal of Nuisance Beaver in Bruce County

1. Trapper **MUST** hold a valid beaver trapping licence with the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR). If trapper is a resident of Bruce County, skip to item 3.
2. If the trapper is **NOT** a Bruce County resident,
  - a. a written document (letter or email) requesting the approval of the Transportation and Environmental Services Committee to trap nuisance beaver in Bruce County **MUST** be submitted to:

  - b. request must include the following information: – trappers full name and address, landowners full name and address, location of problem, description of problem.
  - c. following Committee approval, the trapper will be contacted to confirm approval and forwarded a copy of the resolution. This resolution information **MUST** be provided to the local municipality when presenting and marking beaver tail(s) in the presence of municipal staff.
3. Landowner to complete document 'Landowner Authorization - Nuisance Beaver'
4. MNR Licenced trapper to complete second portion of document 'Landowner Authorization – Nuisance Beaver'
5. Trapper presents MNR licence and beaver tail(s) to municipal office.
6. Municipal staff visually checks Trapper's MNR licence to ensure eligibility.

7. Municipal staff confirms number of beaver tails presented and marks (or observes trapper mark) the tail(s)
8. Municipal staff confirms that the Trapper's information is correct on 'Landowner Authorization – Nuisance Beaver' document and completes bottom portion of document.
9. Municipality to retain beaver tail
10. Municipal staff forward the completed 'Landowner Authorization – Nuisance Beaver' document to Clerk, County of Bruce for compensation to the licensed trapper
11. Compensation is mailed or electronically transferred to the trapper.
